# **OCCUPATIONAL RATE CLASSIFICATIONS**

## **FOREWORD**

This section of the Mutual of Omaha Underwriting Guidelines is designed to assist in the proper occupational rating classification of applicants for Disability (DI), Accident and Major Medical (MM) insurance engaged in the most frequently encountered occupations.

The benefit period, monthly benefit amount and premiums for all of the Company's disability coverages are based upon but not limited to: the degree of education, training and skill demanded by the occupation; the manual dexterity and physical effort required; the hazards to health and safety; job stability; economic and motivational factors specific to the occupation/industry and past Company claim experience. It is important that each application accurately describes the applicant's specific duties, and the percentage of time each of the duties is performed. This information, more frequently than the job title, will be the basis for a fair occupational classification.

Occupations are listed in alphabetical order by job title, as well as general industry, preceded by our numerical job code and the occupational rate classification. To locate an occupation, look first alphabetically and if unable to locate, then check by industry. NEC means not elsewhere classified under any other job title. For occupations not listed, select a related one in which the duties most clearly resemble those of the applicant, or contact an underwriter for assistance in determining a final rating.

This chart will also be used to determine those applicants who do not qualify for the Company's individual Major Medical/Major Hospital products as well as for general coding and rating of Accident only coverage.

## **GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF OCCUPATIONAL CLASSES**

### **CLASS 1A**

Included in this class are mostly executives and professionals such as CPAs, Attorneys, Corporate Executives (earning more than \$75,000 annually) and Pharmacists. Their jobs present no environmental hazards; they normally work in an office where they perform almost exclusively executive and white-collar level functions.

### **CLASS 2A**

This group of managers, professionals and technical workers also perform largely managerial, intellectual, technical or administrative work with high stability/responsibility. Examples include Electronic/Computer Technicians, Bank Cashiers, and most Office Workers with administrative duties only.

**CLASS 3A**

Some of the occupations in this category require more movement and travel and may occasionally encounter a working environment with some additional risk. They still often possess intellectual or technical skills, but the ability to perform their occupational duties often requires more manual dexterity or light physical effort. This class also includes some professionals with less favorable claim experience. Examples include most Health Care Professionals, Geologists with field duties, Electricians and Farmers/Ranchers.

**CLASS B**

Most of these occupations are involved with the construction trades or manufacturing and processing and often involve extensive exposure to tools and machinery. There is a greater emphasis on moderate to heavy physical labor. Examples would include Truck Drivers, most Construction and Factory Workers, Beauticians and Auto Mechanics.

**CLASS B\***

A select group of salaried occupations (B\*) may be considered for a 5-year benefit period. If, after complete application file development, the underwriter determines that such designated applicants are insurable as a standard and nontobacco-using risk, the 5-year benefit period may be available. The nontobacco-use status must be verified through current laboratory testing. See specific product guidelines for more details.

**CLASS N**

These occupations are uninsurable due to a history of unacceptable claims experience, excessive accident or health hazards, and little or no earned income or job stability. Examples of risks unacceptable for DI coverage would be Unemployed or Retired persons, Part-time workers (working less than 30 hours per week), active Military Personnel, Airline Flight Attendants and non-salaried Authors or Writers. Examples of risk unacceptable for Major Medical would be Tree Trimmers or Garbage Collectors. See the TPG for each product line to determine which classes are eligible for that coverage type.

## **MULTIPLE OCCUPATIONS**

If the applicant has more than one gainful occupation, whether full-time (30 or more hours per week), part-time or seasonal, all must be shown. The final occupational rate classification will be the one involving the greatest hazards. Income from the part-time or seasonal occupations will generally NOT be considered for determining monthly benefit amount eligibility/limits.

## **HOME-BASED OCCUPATIONS**

(Applicable to DI only)

1. Business owners working from their home may be considered for individual DI insurance based on the following information:
  - a) Self-employment for a minimum of one year, but preferably two years with a proven history of performance. Copies of any contracts or sources of income will be required.
  - b) Proof of income will be a minimum of the most recent two years income tax returns, including all schedules.
  - c) Applicants should be seen coming and going or must leave the home daily at least 25% of the time to conduct business. If the nature of the work is such that a substantial portion can be performed without leaving the home, and client contact can be made satisfactorily through electronic means, then the risk is normally not acceptable.
2. Professionals working from their home often include Dentists, Medical Practitioners, Lawyers, etc., with an office within the home. They will normally be acceptable for DI coverage provided employee and customer access is through a separate entrance and the location is identified with some type of business sign.
3. Salaried employees working from the home are generally acceptable for DI coverage. Applications should include a description of job duties as well as the percentage of time or hours spent at the employer's worksite.

**SELF-EMPLOYED PERSON/SELF-EMPLOYED DISCOUNT:**  
(Applicable to DI only)

Our newer contracts include specific provisions for discounts for self-employed applicants. Some older plans have specific rules that govern the availability of the self-employed discount through occupational upgrades. Please refer to specific product guidelines for details on how these discounts are applied.

In addition, our newer contracts allow all self-employed class B applicants who meet the requirements for this self-employed discount to qualify for a 5-year benefit period under DI coverage. Tax records to verify income should accompany all such applications.

**CONSULTANTS**

Applicants who act as consultants on a self-employed basis will often cause the need for additional details of job tenure, specific duties and oftentimes the details of the applicant's prior employment. Those self-employed consultants who have been performing their current duties for several years can normally be handled like all other self-employed applicants. Those in the business for less than two years may qualify for coverage, but usually on a limited benefit basis until consistent income and job stability can be established. If these recent tenure applicants can provide the underwriter with verification that she/he is performing the same duties of her/his prior occupation but is now self-employed rather than a W2 employee, consideration can be given for higher benefit amounts and longer benefit periods. Complete copies of signed contracts (if applicable) and tax records may be required for any consideration of an increase in benefits. The key to securing the maximum possible benefits for these applicants will be verification of stable and predictable income and employment. Working with an underwriter prior to writing such applicants would be recommended.

**PREFERRED AND STANDARD  
CLASSIFICATIONS:**  
(Applicable to DI only)

For the purposes of underwriting coverages that still utilize preferred (P) or standard (S) occupational classifications (mostly accident only coverage), the following guidelines will apply:

1. 1A and 2A risk classes will be considered as preferred
2. 3A and B risk classes will be considered as standard

**BUSINESS OVERHEAD EXPENSE:**

The occupational ratings in this guide will also apply to any Business Overhead Expense (BOE) applications. See individual product guides for further BOE requirements.

**GENERAL COMMENTS:**

All listed ratings have been established for operations with modern, safe and well-maintained machinery and equipment, and where adequate safety programs are in effect.

The ratings shown are a guide. The Home Office Underwriters utilizing all available sources of information will determine all final ratings. Your assistance in providing precise details of any applicant's occupational duties will be beneficial toward determining any final rating and/or eligibility status.
